## Families

The central theme to the Chinese culture is family. At a very young age children are taught to respect their elders. Marriages and deaths are marked by rituals that display the importance of continuing the family lineage.

Reverend Stephen Yee Tong – 2nd Minister at the Chinese Mission on 2nd Avenue SW


